# About Our School

Mar Gregorios Public School (MGPS), located in Mogappair West, Chennai, is a prominent educational institution managed by the Diocese of St. Ephrem, Khadki, Pune, under the Malankara Syrian Catholic Trust, Chennai. The school, part of a larger network of Malankara Catholic institutions, stands as a beacon of quality education and Christian values. The origins of this educational journey trace back to 2014, with the school itself being officially founded in 2014.

## Foundation and Early Years (2014-2016)

The foundation of MGPS was laid in 2014 under the visionary leadership of His Excellency Dr. Jacob Mar Barnabas, with Rev. Fr. Sabu M. George serving as the Local Manager. The school began with humble beginnings, starting with just 34 students, four teachers, and one assisting staff member. The first Principal, Sr. Alpha, guided the institution through its early days, setting the tone for future growth. The school quickly became known for its dedication to holistic education, marked by various celebrations such as Children's Day, Christmas Day, Pongal, and an Annual Day event for the 2015 batch. In April 2016, the school released its first magazine, "SAPIENTIA," showcasing the talents of its students.

## Growth and Expansion (2015-2019)

Under the management of His Excellency Dr. Thomas Mar Anthonios, and with Rev. Fr. Sabu M. George continuing as the Local Manager, the school saw a gradual increase in staff and students. By 2017, the school employed seven teachers and two assisting staff, catering to 54 students. This period was marked by a variety of events and extracurricular activities, including exhibitions, inter-school competitions, and celebrations of national and cultural significance. In 2018, the school achieved a significant milestone by shifting to a new building, which laid the foundation for future expansion. The school continued to grow, offering activities such as Taekwondo, swimming, classical dance, drawing, and music, nurturing the all-round development of its students.

## Navigating Challenges (2020-2022)

The COVID-19 pandemic posed significant challenges, but MGPS adapted swiftly. Under the continued leadership of His Excellency Dr. Thomas Mar Anthonios and the management of Rev. Fr. Philip Pulipra, the school transitioned to online education. With 15 teachers and three assisting staff, MGPS maintained academic continuity through online classes, competitions, and club activities. Despite the pandemic, the school continued to observe important days such as Father's Day, Yoga Day, and Teachers' Day through virtual platforms. In September 2022, Rev. Fr. Mathew Pallikunnel was appointed as the new Local Manager, and the school received the No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Tamil Nadu Government, paving the way for its future growth.

## CBSE Affiliation and Recent Developments (2023-2024)

A major milestone was achieved in 2023 when MGPS was granted affiliation by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) on 6th August, marking a new chapter in the school's history. This recognition was a testament to the school's commitment to providing high-quality education. The leadership of His Excellency Dr. Thomas Mar Anthonios, Rev. Fr. Mathew Pallikunnel, and Principal Sr. Saleena Grace.DM played a crucial role in this achievement. The school's community, including parents and staff, celebrated this significant accomplishment with renewed zeal and determination.

In 2024, under the guidance of His Excellency Dr. Mathews Mar Pachomios as Chairman, Rt. Rev. Monsignor Shaji Mathews Vazhayil as Corporate Manager, and Rev. Fr. Thomas Keelathu as Local Manager and Principal, MGPS has continued its upward trajectory. The school has expanded to include a Class X with 15 students, supported by 27 teachers, five assisting staff, and the leadership of Vice Principal Sr. Salvia DM and Head Teacher Ms. Nithya Vijay.

## Looking Ahead

As MGPS looks to the future, it remains committed to its mission of providing holistic education rooted in Christian values. With its CBSE affiliation, dedicated staff, and supportive community, Mar Gregorios Public School is well-positioned to continue its legacy of academic excellence and character formation, empowering its students to succeed in all areas of life.
